

# Sixth Form Dress Code



We are a uniformed school, and we expect Sixth Form students to attend school in 'business smart' wear, as if you are attending a smart business meeting.

## Formal Days

On certain days of the year, including school photo days, school tours, Open Day, Visitation and others, all students are required to wear their Formal uniform. This is a white shirt or blouse and black (or dark grey/navy) suit, skirt or trousers. If a shirt is worn it should be worn with a tie. Smart shoes are required.

## Normal School Days

On normal school days you can wear the same, or be a little less formal. You should always come to school as if you are attending a smart business meeting. Please see below what can and can't be worn:

		
<b>Trousers and Skirts</b>	Suits, trousers, skirts or dresses must be tailored and smart	Denim, cargos, leisure wear, tracksuit trousers should never be worn to school
<b>Tops</b>	Shirts, blouses, knitwear, plain polo shirts in any colour are all fine. Ties and jackets are welcome but not required	No hoodies, sweatshirts, T shirts, vest or crop tops. Tops with a slogan or logo are not to be worn to school. Tops should be appropriate for a business meeting
<b>Shoes</b>	Smart, clean shoes, sandals or boots are to be worn. This can include smart 'office' trainers	Sports trainers are not to be worn to school, except on the astro/fields. Converse style boots are not to be worn
<b>Other</b>	Hair should be of a natural colour, even if it's not your own. You may wear earrings, and one subtle facial piercing if you wish	Hair should not be dyed any colour that isn't a natural 'human' hair colour. No other piercings should be seen in school. No visible tattoos

There is no summer dress code, still dress for a smart business meeting on a warm day.

You are expected to be in Sixth Form dress whenever you are in school during the school day. When sitting an A level exam you may dress a little more comfortably, but must be sure your clothes have no writing on at all.

In accepting a place in the Sixth Form you are accepting our dress code. Sanctions are given for not meeting expectations. Serious transgressions will result in being sent home, or studying in the SALC all day. If you repeatedly ignore the school's dress code expectations you will move to having to wear the 'formal dress code' every day.
