Biology - Inheritance, variation, and evolution, works of Frances Oldham Kelsey, how disease and the impacts of science affect people differently

English Literature - 'An Inspector Calls' - exploring gender roles in a patriarchal society; discussing the impact of the class system, 'The Merchant of Venice' - exploring gender roles in Elizabethan England; discussing the impact of racial stereotyping such as anti-semitism, OCR Conflict poetry - studying of poetry reflecting the diverse range of voices in poetry

English Language - Past papers have explored issues such as race, gender stereotyping and the impact of class

PE - Socio-cultural issues in sport, including age, gender, ethnicity, religion, culture, discrimination, media coverage, and role models; sports from different cultures.

History - Crime and Punishment unit, introduction of anti-racism laws, gender equality, legalising homosexuality

Geography - Sustaining Ecosystems (Antarctic, Arctic, Bolivian Amazon), Urban Futures (Rosario and London), Dynamic Development (Ethiopia), Climate Change (broad strands globally), Hazards (Big dry Australia, Boscastle UK, Iceland volcano, Japan earthquake), UK in 21st century (Somalia)

Biology - Genetic info, variation and relationships between organisms, works of Henrietta Lacks, how disease and the impacts of science affect people differently

English - 'Americanah' *Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie* - deals with issues surrounding race and gender, 'Rapture' *Carol Ann Duffy* and 'Why be happy when you could be normal?', *Jeanette Winterson* - deals with issues related to sexuality and gender, OCR Language and Literature Anthology - studying a diverse range of written/spoken non-fiction texts dealing with issues related to mental health, class, gender and race

Economics - Development Economics

History - Britain 1780-1870, Abolition of Slave trade; Students select individual topics for their coursework, each year this includes extremely diverse topics, e.g. causes of African colonisation, Mao's China, Ottoman history, etc. Stonewall

Geography - Resource security (global oil, Saudi Arabia, Mali, France Brazil, Niger delta, Aswan dam, Chile, global mining operations), Water and Carbon (Amazon rainforest), Changing places (Detroit), Hazards (Phillipines, Haiti, Australia), Global governance (Antarctica)

MFL - Multiculturalism and Racism in German, Spanish, and French

PE - Socio-cultural issues in sport, global sporting events

Politics - Identity Politics, link to ethnicity; Nationalism, including post-colonial nationalism, internationalism, ethnicity and culture; Global Politics, including globalisation and the state, global governance, regionalism

Psychology - Gender, including the difference between sex and gender, development of gender identity, cultural bias
